**TO BE AN AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICER
YOUR MUST***

- **Be a resident of Nassau County**
- **Be 18 years or older**
- **Be a citizen of the United States**
- **Possess a valid NYS driver's License**
- **Possess a high school diploma or GED**
- **Have a good moral character without a felony conviction. (A misdemeanor conviction may also prevent acceptance.**
- **Have no more than (1) alcohol related driving offense**
- **Pass a physical examination**
- **Submit to fingerprinting**
- **Consent to a background investigation**
- **Submit to a drug test and willing to submit to a psychological exam.**

*** Members with certain disabilities may be eligible to serve in non-patrol duties, such as a Communications Officer**

- * **Manage traffic at parades and special events such as L.I. Marathon, March of Dimes Walkathon, firework displays, numerous holiday ceremonies and festivities**
- * **Provide assistance and support services during disasters and other emergencies**

WHAT TRAINING DOES AN AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICER RECEIVE

As a candidate, you attend and complete a 22 session basic training course given at the Nassau County Police Academy.

This training includes:

- * **Peace Officers Powers**
- * **NYS Penal Law**
- * **Hazardous Material Awareness**
- * **Baton Training**
- * **Blood-Borne Pathogens**
- * **Basic First Aid/CPR**
- * **Traffic and Pedestrian Control**
- * **Response to Critical Incidents**
- * **Minimum ten (10) hours per month required for membership**

COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER

Officers serving in this unit engage in various tasks: Coordinating and documenting daily and emergency functions of personnel, telephone networking of members duties, radio dispatching of units on patrol, managing emergency response to disasters and events, along with providing an important link to other law enforcement agencies as well as fire, medical and governmental entities.
